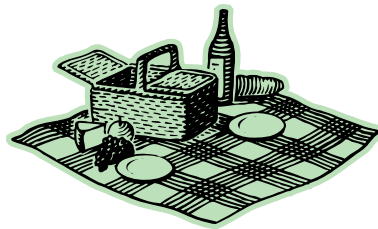

Rubicon Trail Work Weekend**

July 19 – 20, 2008

Supported by the Rubicon Trail Foundation and Olympic4x4 Products

The Planning Team (Jeepers Jamboree and FOTR) met 7/9/08 and ironed out the final plans for July 19th work weekend. We'll be doing two major jobs on Cadillac Hill.

STEAK dinner is the first thing you need to know!!! Saturday night at the Springs, prepared by the Jambo Cook Crew too. Wow. We can thank Olympic4x4 Products (my friend and sponsor, Eric Lichtbach, www.olympic4x4products.com) and the Rubicon Trail Foundation (www.rubicontrail.org) for dinner. The Foundation is also supporting us with the necessary supplies and materials we need to do this job.

We'll have three primary teams:

Team Spring: Kevin Arnold, Team Leader, Scott Johnston Deputy TL. This is the natural spring up top where we need to get it directly across the trail and head down off the mountain AWAY from the trail. We'll harden the water crossing and then cut a trench or whatever we need to do to direct the water in its old course (and not down the trail). We want this to be a good fix that will hold up for a while.

Shovels, pick axes, McCloud tools, loppers should do it.

Team Roots: Rusty Folea OPS and Roots Team Leader. Down towards the base of Cadillac to work on the "Roots" section of the trail, just up from the Slabs there after you leave the grave, to add a gabion to that area and repair trail damage, as well as close off a bypass. Chicken wire rock-wraps will be constructed on site to fill the roots area that has been damaged (and bypassed). Trailers will be needed to haul a few loads of rocks from down by Miller Creek or at least at the base of hill by the grave.

Gloves, hand tools, shovels, pry bars, picks, and rocks will be needed.

Team Rocks: Jeff Hill, Team Leader. Load trailers from by the grave and Miller Creek as needed. Rotate team members often.

John Arenz will be our safety man and vegetation management consultant. He'll work all sections of the job as needed. After helping the Spring Team get started, he'll take some folks and work down towards the illegal bypass above Morris Rock and get that blocked off. Then he'll work his way down to the Roots Team to see if they need any extra help.

Randy Burleson will be our Commo guy and will be stationed at the Hairpin Turn (most likely) and rove as necessary. Randy will also assist with Information and Safety issues.

When the Spring Team is done, they'll work their way downhill to the Roots Team to help them finish that job or load rock as needed.

We'll shoot to be in Rubicon Springs by 5pm at the latest.

Rusty will line up some chicken wire, rebar to anchor the gabion, wire cutters, and some horse fencing to build rock wraps and gabion material.

BRIEFING: 7am Tahoe Side Staging Area. Yea, I know that's early, but we felt this was important if we're going to get in a good day. It will take us a couple hours just to get to the job site.

Stacie has lined up a TV crew to shoot and interview us doing this job. She'll assist with press, sign-in, and documentation.

The Rubicon Trail Foundation (\$100) and Olympic4x4 Products (\$200) have us covered for dinner at the Springs that night.

TAILGATE SAFETY SESSION

Job Hazards Analysis

EVENT: ___July 2008 Work Weekend___ Incident Commander: ___Del Albright___

EVENT DATE: ___7/19-20/08___ Safety Officer: ___John Arenz___

I. PROJECT OVERVIEW:

Erosion control work and water course maintenance; Root section of trail repair and rock-filling; and rock loading/hauling in trailers.

II. KEY DANGER POINTS:

Handling rocks; eye dangers; dehydration; shovels and hand tools; trailers on the trail with rock.

III. SAFETY GEAR CONSIDERATIONS:

Eye protection (sunglasses or safety glasses) required for work dangerous to eye safety. Gloves suggested for all volunteers to protect hands and fingers. Keep an eye on your fellow volunteer for signs of heat illness.

IV. PERSONAL HEALTH & HYGIENE:

Drink plenty of water; stay hydrated. Watch for snakes. Be cautious of tripping hazards. Wear good boots.
